ENERGY SAVINGS

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: I can confirm that savings of approximately \$7.4 million are factored into the 2006-07 budgets of agencies. Details for each portfolio are provided under the heading 'Memorandum items—measures prior to the 2006-07 Budget' in tables 2.6 to 2.18 of Budget Paper 3.

MOTOR ACCIDENT COMMISSION

In reply to **Mr GOLDSWORTHY**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: The Motor Accident Commission has provided an updated chart of new claims lodged, flowing from the referenced MAC 2004-05 annual report (i.e. from 01 July 2005) to 31 October 2006.

While new claims appear to be levelling out, the new claims received in 2005-06 represent a decrease over 2004-05 new claims received of 6.2 per cent. In addition, the new claims received in the last twelve months (November 2005 to October 2006 inclusive) represent a decrease in new claims received over the corresponding period in 2004-05 of 8.4 per cent.

As to the honourable member's second question, the Motor Accident Commission confirms that the savings from the investigation of fraudulent and exaggerated claims in 2005-06 was a reported \$5.98 million.

GOVERNMENT CONTRACTS

In reply to **Mr HAMILTON-SMITH**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: Treasurer's Instruction 27 *Disclosure of Government Contracts* was withdrawn as the Acting Crown Solicitor advised, during the review of the Treasurer's Instructions in 2005, that the Instruction did not relate to matters of financial administration, as required by the relevant clause of the *Public Finance and Audit Act 1987*.

The contract disclosure policy is an important element of the Government's honesty and accountability framework and accordingly, the policy was reissued as a Premier and Cabinet Circular. To reinforce the scope of its application, Premier and Cabinet Circular 27 includes the express statement that Cabinet has approved that the Circular applies to all public authorities subject to the *Public Finance and Audit Act 1987*.

While Premier and Cabinet Circulars are not legally enforceable (other than indirectly by way of disciplinary action against an employee who has failed to comply with a direction to act in accordance with the Circular), the contract disclosure policy reflects a Cabinet decision and all Ministers are bound by the Cabinet decision.

The Acting Crown Solicitor advised that the publication of a Cabinet decision by the Department of the Premier and Cabinet arguably gives rise to an implied direction given by each Minister to agencies under their direction to comply with the Circular. The Government would expect all public authorities subject to the *Public Finance and Audit Act 1987* to comply with the requirements of Premier and Cabinet Circular 27.

SHARED SERVICES REVIEW TEAM

In reply to **Mr HAMILTON-SMITH**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: The Shared Services Reform Office (SSRO) was established as part of the Department of Treasury and Finance in September. Expressions of interest to join the team were called for on Friday 22 September 2006. There are currently 9 people in SSRO (11 from 13 November 2006) and it is envisaged that this will increase to around 20 to 25 as the data collection, planning and implementation processes get underway. Potential applicants for financial analyst positions (around 4 to 6) are currently being considered. The current members of the SSRO are:

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

In reply to **Mr HAMILTON-SMITH**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: The Commonwealth figure of \$3 441.7 million is based on the Australian Taxation Commissioner's Determination of GST revenue for 2005-06 after netting off the recovery by the Commonwealth of GST overpayments made in 2004-05. The Determination is made prior to the completion of the 2005-06 year.

The figure of \$3 472.3 million reported in Table 4 of South Australian Budget Paper No 3 is South Australia's share of actual GST collections in 2005-06 together with South Australia's share of compensation for the deferral of GST payments by small business and residual adjustments to funding arrangements that relate back to 2003-04. In addition, provision has been made for anticipated recoveries by the Commonwealth in the event of over compensation for GST losses from changes in GST payment arrangements for small business.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: The Table below provides a split of Table 4.3 (Budget Paper 3, page 4.6).

*GST is adjusted to allow for the indirect impact on South Australia's grant share resulting from the removal of abolished taxes from the Commonwealth Grants Commission's relativity calculations. GMA is adjusted to allow for the direct cost to South Australia of the abolished taxes as they are abolished.

In compiling Table 4.3, the projections of Commonwealth Grants Commission relativities, and hence the distribution of GST grants and financial assistance grants (the major component of the GMA) for 2007-08 onwards, have been based on a methodology agreed by the States, Territories and the Commonwealth for use in the calculation and projection of the difference between GST and the GMA for all States on a consistent basis. It is not intended to be a projection of gross GST grants to an individual State.

In contrast, for the purposes of South Australia's budget projections of GST revenue grants (as detailed in Table 3.11 of the Budget Statement) a more detailed estimation is undertaken of significant State specific impacts on South Australia's GST revenue share.

Also, in accordance with the agreed methodology for calculation of the GMA, the 2005-06 estimates in Table 4.3 are on a cash basis consistent with the Australian Taxation Commissioner's Determination, whereas Table 3.11 is compiled on a basis consistent with actual GST collections for the relevant year (as explained in a separate Estimates Committee question entitled: GST, Federal State Difference).

The adjusted GMA and GST estimates derived by South Australia will differ from those contained in the Commonwealth's May 2006 budget due to the use of more up-to-date GST estimates by South Australia and the recognition of abolished taxes in the GMA as they are abolished (rather than the Commonwealth's method of including revenue forgone from abolished taxes in the GMA only when all States have abolished them).

PORTFOLIO REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE LINES

In reply to **Mr HAMILTON-SMITH.**

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: The Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure has incorporated gross revenue and expenditure information for each sub-program within the department's Portfolio Statements.

Due to the significant amount of revenue allocated to the department's sub-programs, the net cost of sub-program information alone did not provide the desired level of information regarding activity levels within the department's sub-programs. This was particularly the case where revenue and expenditure amounts for a sub-program are of a similar magnitude. The addition of gross revenue and expenditure provided by the Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure supplements the net cost of sub-program information provided for all sub-programs within the Portfolio Statements.

This information was included at the Department's request.

It is not my intention to mandate this disclosure for other agencies.

ACCRUAL APPROPRIATION EXCESS FUNDS

In reply to **Mr HAMILTON-SMITH.**

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: As previously agreed and as indicated in my initial response, the policy on accrual appropriation excess funds accounts will be made available when it has been completed.

CONSULTANTS

In reply to **Mr HAMILTON-SMITH.**

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: Total consultancy expenditure by government departments and commercial businesses in 2005-06 was \$25.8 million.

The breakdown of total consultancy expenditure by government sector for 2005-06 was:

- General Government—\$18.6 million
- Public Non Financial Corporations—\$4.2 million
- Public Financial Corporations—\$3 million

TARGETED VOLUNTARY SEPARATION PACKAGES

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS.**

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: As indicated in my initial response, I am not aware of any advice from the Commissioner for Public Employment that we will require a TVSP scheme to achieve the budgeted savings outcomes.

COMPULSORY THIRD PARTY FUND

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS.**

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: As at 30 June 2005 the Motor Accident Commission (MAC) Direct Property Portfolio consisted of six buildings diversified across commercial, industrial and retail sectors with properties located in Adelaide, Melbourne and Brisbane to ensure the portfolio is not exposed to any particular market. The value of the portfolio was \$87.358 million.

Just prior to 30 June 2005 a new industrial property at Beverley was contracted at \$6.7 million and this settled on 1 July 2005. A further two office buildings in Brisbane were purchased as set out below.

- Building 8, 2404 Logan Road, Eight Mile Plains \$7.4 million; and
 - Building 18, 2404 Logan Road, Eight Mile Plains \$8.25 million.
- A further industrial distribution centre in Melbourne was contracted in August 2005 for \$24.26 million with settlement on practical completion as at mid July 2006.

As at 30 June 2006 the value of the portfolio was \$119.58 million, as shown in the table below:

The portfolio return for the financial year ending 30 June 2006 was 14.4 per cent (benchmark 14.4 per cent) and the three year performance to 30 June 2006 was 13.4 per cent as opposed to the benchmark of 12.8 per cent. MAC is satisfied with the long term out performance of the portfolio when compared to the benchmark.

MAJOR TRANSPORT INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS

HOUSING TRUST

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

In reply to **Mr VENNING**.

The Hon. K.O. FOLEY: The SA Housing Trust had a land tax liability of \$97.1 million in 2004-05 which was paid on the due date of 17 January, 2005.

In 2005-06, the Trust had a land tax liability of \$115.9 million. The due date was 12 January 2006 (5 days earlier than in 2004-05) but the Trust paid the tax in advance of the due date (on 19 and 20 December, 2005).

The Trust is fully funded from the Budget for its land tax liabilities and does not need to borrow to meet these costs.

On 7 December 2005, the South Australian Housing Trust requested Treasury and Finance to provide appropriation to enable the Trust to meet its 2005-06 land tax liability. The transfer of funds was made and the land tax paid on 19 and 20 December 2005.

Although quarterly land tax billing was introduced in 2005-06, the Trust continues to pay land tax annually.

The estimated budget result reported in the Mid Year Budget Review was not affected by the difference in the timing of the payment of the Trust's land tax liability. In cash terms, a full year's tax was paid by the Trust in 2004-05 and in 2005-06. There was no timing impact on annual cash collections.

Even if there had been a timing difference that caused cash collections to be low in one year, this would not impact on the budget bottom line as timing impacts are removed in accrual-based reporting.

WORKCOVER

In reply to **Mr WILLIAMS**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: The question relates to the reduction in the new income maintenance claims rate measure result as published in the June WorkCover quarterly performance report. The result was a 5.7 per cent increase. Analysis suggests that this was due to significant activity by two former claims agents (Allianz and Vero) which were determining outstanding new claims prior to the cessation of their contracts on 31 March 2006. The new income maintenance claims rate measure is a volatile measure and quarter-to-quarter variations may not reflect a real change in the underlying performance of occupational health and safety. WorkCover, through its partnership with SafeWork SA, is monitoring this indicator and co-operating in the development of occupational health and safety strategies, to be implemented by SafeWork SA, which will impact positively on the outcomes for this indicator.

WORKCOVER

In reply to **Mr WILLIAMS**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: The increase in quarterly claims payments for the June 2006 quarter was due primarily to the WorkCover Redemption Project. This Project was initiated by WorkCover prior to the transition of claims management to Employers Mutual on 1 July 2006. The redemption activity in June 2006 quarter increased claims payments by approximately \$45 million.

Table 1 below shows the number of claims redeemed, total redemption payments and average redemption amounts for the quarters from December 2004 to June 2006. 918 redemptions were paid in the June 2006 quarter. This is an increase of approximately 700-720 redemptions compared to previous quarters. On average, WorkCover redeems around 200 claims per quarter. Total expenditure on redemptions for the June 2006 quarter was \$54 058 900.94.

The average redemption amount for the June 2006 quarter was \$58 900. This is an increase on average by \$17 700 compared to the previous quarters. The average redemption amount for the previous six quarters is around \$41 200.

In reply to **Mr WILLIAMS**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: Redemptions are payments that are made to finalise a claim for compensation, and are provided for by section 42 of the Workers Rehabilitation and Compensation Act 1986 ('the Act'). A redemption can only be finalised and paid where agreement is reached between the two parties—the compensating authority and the injured worker. Neither party can be forced to agree to a redemption.

An agreement for the redemption of a liability cannot be made unless the injured worker has received competent financial advice about the investment or use of the money to be received on redemption. The injured worker must also receive competent professional advice about the consequences of redemption. A recognised medical expert needs to certify that the extent of the injured worker's incapacity resulting from the compensable disability can be determined with a reasonable degree of confidence.

I am advised that when WorkCover contacts injured workers to ascertain whether they are interested in entering into redemption discussions, they set an indicative timeframe for a response. The response timeframe does not preclude injured workers from making

it clear they are not interested in discussing a redemption, rejecting redemption offers and/or negotiating counter offers.

If after receiving expert financial and professional advice, an injured worker decides not to agree to a redemption, this does not preclude them from considering a future offer from WorkCover or making an offer to WorkCover at any stage.

EMPLOYEE OMBUDSMAN

In reply to **Mr HANNA**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: There is no requirement for advertising for the appointment of the Employee Ombudsman. I consulted as required to appoint the current Employee Ombudsman.

GOODS AND SERVICES

In reply to **Mr WILLIAMS**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: The Income Budget for 2006-07 totals \$5.618 million.

\$5.611 million of this figure relates to the sale of goods and services and covers the following items:

LAND SERVICES DELAYS

In reply to **Hon. R.G. KERIN**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised the main driver for division applications appears to be land values with the average site value increasing from \$81 000 in 2002 to \$161 000 in 2006, an increase of 98 per cent. This provides an economic incentive to increase new divisions and urban rejuvenation.

I am also advised that there has been a slight decrease in lodgements for 2005-06. Should this decline continue, it is expected that the number of working days taken will decrease. It is the government's intention to further review the process for additional improvement.

INSPECTIONS

In reply to **Mr PISONI**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised the 18 908 visits for 2005-06 refer to workplace inspection visits by SafeWork SA inspectors.

The inspector's role includes advice, assistance, compliance and enforcement activities. Each inspection visit involves elements of advice and assistance. Around half of the visits (8 979) are recorded as 'proactive' which means they were for the primary purpose of providing advice and assistance to businesses on how to comply with workplace laws. SafeWork SA does not record information on the size of the business visited in each case.

I understand that the proactive visits to the workplace may be triggered through a contact with SafeWork SA's Help and Early Intervention Centre, or through a targeted intervention campaign aimed at addressing areas of high risk or poor performance. The largest current targeted intervention program is called the Industry Improvement Program. This Program is specifically aimed at identifying and visiting businesses where workers compensation data indicates that the number of injury claims are increasing.

Under this program, the improvement strategy for small business is based on the use of advice and assistance as the primary means of encouraging compliance with occupational health and safety (OHS) laws. Eight OHS industry advisors coordinate this campaign. In addition to visiting the workplaces, the industry advisors convene stakeholder consultative committees, which include representatives of small business associations. Each committee has as part of its focus, the improvement of OHS in small business within their industry sector.

I am also advised that SafeWork SA is developing a comprehensive Small Business Strategy for South Australia. This strategy includes extensive consultation with small business representatives, trialing of an OHS small business advisory service at shopping centres, training of Responsible Officers in small businesses, sponsorship of small business awards and the provision of increased levels of advice and assistance to small business.

While SafeWork SA is unable to provide specific statistics on the number of compliance notices issued to small businesses for 2005-06, an analysis of prosecutions for the 2005-06 year indicates that approximately 15 percent of all prosecutions for the year involved small businesses. A total of 3 573 Improvement Notices, 623 prohibition notices and 0 infringement notices were served across all industry sectors to organisations of all sizes.

In reply to **Mr PISONI**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that SafeWork SA's Help and Early Intervention Centre (the Help Centre) consists of a call centre, a library and bookshop and an early intervention service

which involves the provision of detailed advice on workplace issues to employers and employees as well as assistance in the resolution of disputes.

The services of the Help Centre are provided at 100 Weymouth Street where there is direct client access. There are 29 staff positions in the Help Centre.

I am also advised that the Help Centre staff provide assistance and advisory services over the phone or through direct client contact in the library and bookshop. Staff of the Help Centre do not normally visit workplaces. Where a client indicates that a workplace visit is required, the matter is referred to an OHS inspector or industry advisor for follow up. There are 95 OHS inspectors and 8 industry advisors who may respond to these requests. All of the OHS inspectors and industry advisors provide advice and assistance as part of their duties.

WORKCHOICES

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that the best available statistics on post WorkChoices coverage for laws applying to industrial instruments and employment generally is unpublished data from the Australian Bureau of Statistics in May 2004.

This data estimates that in South Australia, incorporated bodies, state government corporations, local government and the federal government account for the employment of 59.2 per cent of the state's employees. The remaining 40.8 per cent work in the unincorporated sector and state government.

Therefore, the percentage falling outside the state industrial relations system is estimated to be 59.2 per cent.

I am also advised that prior to the introduction of WorkChoices general estimates had federal coverage at 45 per cent and state coverage at 55 per cent¹. This indicates that less than 15 per cent of our workforce shifted to the federal industrial relation system due to the advent of WorkChoices in March 2006.

This is not a major change and we estimate that at least 250 000 of the State's 615 000 non-farm employees will continue to have all their conditions of employment governed by our industrial relations laws and the remaining 365 000 will be covered by the federal system².

OH&S MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

In reply to **Mr WILLIAMS**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: SafeWork SA visits workplaces for the purpose of ensuring compliance with occupational health, safety and welfare legislation. In pursuing this goal, OHS inspectors use advice, assistance, compliance and enforcement tools appropriate to each situation.

Traditionally, a workplace inspection visit may have been focused on looking only at specific physical hazards that can be identified visually (for example, a machine without guarding). This type of inspection is limited in that it can only address certain

specific problems at one point in time. Whilst physical inspection is part of every inspector's role, it is now recognised both nationally and internationally, that this type of approach will not result in a systematic approach to addressing occupational health and safety concerns within organisations. Rather, a systematic approach requires an ongoing and comprehensive approach to managing risks in a workplace through consultation with employees.

The concept of risk management involves identifying hazards, assessing the risks associated with them and implementing control measures to eliminate or minimise those risks. To be successful, a risk management approach is dependent on commitment by senior management and the involvement of all people in the workplace. For this reason, modern OHS legislation now requires consultation arrangements and hazard identification, risk assessment and control practices for each task performed in the workplace.

OHS inspectors now focus their work on establishing the extent of OHS management systems in place within organisations. This means ensuring that not only are physical hazards addressed, but that appropriate training, planning, assignment of responsibilities, maintenance schedules and work procedures are in place.

Typically, an inspector will assess compliance with OHS legislation by visually inspecting the workplace, talking with management and employees, examining arrangements in place for consultation and risk management and checking maintenance schedules and other records. This approach ensures a comprehensive review of the organisation's commitment to complying with health and safety requirements and provides a consistent basis on which to determine whether advice, assistance or compliance action will be necessary.

The increased number of inspections in recent years combined with the increased number of compliance notices served, indicates that non-compliance is regularly identified in South Australian workplaces. The inspector's approach is to work with each organisation to raise their level of awareness and understanding of the requirements and to ensure that compliance is achieved through the systematic identification of hazards and the assessment and control of risks. Through this approach, the number of injuries is expected to decline.

Clear evidence that this approach is more effective is demonstrated by the results of the New Claims Project – a joint initiative delivered by SafeWork SA and WorkCover in 2005. This project showed that for 21 targeted employers, the total number of claims reduced by 39 percent (from 173 to 105 claims) between July and September 2005 compared to the same period in 2004. Feedback from employers indicated that the comprehensive assessment of OHS management systems assisted them to address OHS issues in a practical manner. SafeWork SA's Industry Improvement Program, currently being delivered, is based on the same approach.

GOODS AND SERVICES

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: As indicated in my response in Parliament:

In 2005-06 \$4 million was transferred to SafeWork SA from WorkCover.

The variance between the 2005-06 Income Budget of \$1.145 million and the estimated result of \$4.645 million for the sale of goods and services reflects the funds transfer of \$3.5 million to SafeWork SA from WorkCover.

The additional \$500 000 in kind component of this transfer is included under the 2005-06 Estimated Result for Other.

SERVICE SA CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTRES

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that Federal funding was initially provided to community groups to establish Small Rural Transaction Centres, which delivered Service SA services. This project had a capacity of 10 agents.

From June 2002, Service SA commenced delivery arrangements from 10 Rural Agent locations. Three were later ceased due to non-performance.

From 1 July 2003, the State government has provided funding to maintain Service SA services provided via the Agents.

The goal of the Rural Agent Program was to promote and deliver equitable service delivery to small rural communities enabling increased access to State Government products and services.

Service SA Rural Agents are Local Government Council, Community Association or State Government Agency organisations that agree to manage local service delivery in rural locations for the Minister for Administrative Services. Service SA is charged with administering the relationships between Minister and the Agents.

I am advised that the termination of services delivery arrangements with three pilot Rural Agents occurred due to their non-performance in three areas

- Lack of financial transaction activity
- Lack of informational services provision
- Lack of marketing and promotion activities undertaken

The three Rural Agents to have their agreement with Service SA to deliver services discontinued were Kimba, Cleve and Jamestown. During the six-month pilot period Jamestown completed only four transactions, with Cleve and Kimba completing none. They did not provide any marketing and promotions at the local level, the undertaking of which was a specific requirement of the funding provided to them. This is in comparison to the other 7 pilot locations, which averaged 49 transactions over the six-month pilot period and performed numerous marketing and promotional activities.

Impact of closure on the community was perceived to be minimal due to the low level of service experienced during the time of operation.

The remaining seven Rural Agents are still operating. These Agents are located at Wudinna, Yorketown, Peterborough, Keith, Streaky Bay, Port Broughton and Port MacDonnell.

COUNTRY HEALTH SA

In reply to **Mr PENGILLY**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that:

1. The cost for the operation of the Country Health SA Board including fees and travel and accommodation costs as the Board travels through country South Australia to meet with local communities is \$300 000. This is offset in part by the costs of operating the previous boards and is equivalent to the cost of operating metropolitan regional boards. Allocations have not been made to date for the 2007-08 and 2008-09 years.

MODBURY HOSPITAL

In reply to **Ms CHAPMAN**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that:

1. The Modbury Hospital management fee for 2006-07 will be \$75.016 million plus adjustment for award variations and other agreed variations.
2. The amount budgeted for 2006-07 is \$75.016 million.
3. It is estimated that 426 actual nurses and 286 actual non nurses will be transferred, representing 256.6 full time equivalent nurses and 167.6 full time equivalent non nurses.

TARGETED VOLUNTARY SEPARATION PACKAGES

In reply to **Ms CHAPMAN**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that:

1. The savings for the years 2006-10 total \$6.7 million and relate to 27 employees.

These employees separated from the following areas of the Portfolio:

- Department of Health (7)
- Central Northern Adelaide Health Service (9)
- Children, Youth & Women's Health Service (3)
- Southern Adelaide Health Service (2)
- Metropolitan Domiciliary Care (4)
- Repatriation General Hospital (1)
- Riverland Regional Health Service (1).

HEALTH BUDGET

In reply to **Ms CHAPMAN**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that:

In answer to the member's direct questions, during the 2005-06 year, the following adjustments were made:

- Approximately \$24.4 million was provided to meet the cost of the latest Salaried Medical Officers Enterprise Agreement in addition to what was provided in the 2005-06 budget.
- Approximately \$12.2 million additional expenditure is in relation to Commonwealth funded programs. The increase mostly relates

to an increase of \$7.7 million for payments under the Department for Veteran Affairs Agreement and \$5.8 million under the highly specialised drugs agreement. There was also a decrease in receipts under the Australian Health Care Agreement of \$2.6 million.

- Approximately \$16.3 million of increased expenditure was attributable to transfers of programs and functions. The principal components of this increase includes the transfer of BreastScreen SA of \$7.1 million, transfer of the Tobacco Unit totalling \$3.8 million and the transfer of other employees to health regions and health units of \$4 million.
- Approximately \$26.8 million of the increase in expenditure between the 2005-06 budget and estimated result is related to expenditure that was budgeted to occur during 2004-2005 but did not and for which approval was given to incur the expenditure in 2005-06.

During the 2005-06 financial year, there was no additional budget supplementation provided for the Nurses/Midwives Enterprise Agreement to that already reflected in the 2005-06 original budget.

VISITING MEDICAL SPECIALISTS AGREEMENT

In reply to Ms CHAPMAN.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that:

1. It is not possible to draw the conclusion that all 688 Visiting Medical Specialists (VMS) are working an extra 2 hours per week at a cost of an additional \$33 000 per annum. The Department of Health VMS Agreement 2006 (VMSA) allows VMS to work up to 20 hours per week and the total cost of the VMSA is the sum of the cost of all the new provisions, including increases to the hourly rates of pay.

The VMSA provides for a 30 per cent increase to the hourly rate of pay over three years for all VMS. The first increase of 17.3 per cent was operative on and from the first full pay fortnight following 1 July 2006.

2. A copy of the VMSA will be provided to Ms Chapman.

HOSPITALS, ASBESTOS REVIEW

In reply to Mr PENGILLY.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that as part of 'Asbestos Management in Government Buildings' guidelines implemented in June 2005, an asbestos register review was undertaken by each agency of government, through the Asbestos Liaison Unit in the Department of Transport, Energy and Infrastructure, to assemble a whole-of-government assessment of asbestos status and to form the basis of annual reporting on progress with asbestos removal now required.

The register for Angaston Hospital confirms that the hospital, consistent with its age, contains a number of areas of asbestos containing materials, including vinyl floor coverings, wall linings, eaves linings, ceiling and window panels, all of which have been assessed as being in a stable condition and with proper cautionary labelling requiring only ongoing monitoring.

The Department of Health will be undertaking updates of asbestos registers during 2007, to include risk-based assessments that will guide prioritising for a progressive asbestos removal program. Angaston Hospital's asbestos register is being updated as part of this process.

COUNTRY HEALTH SA

In reply to Ms CHAPMAN.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that International Medical Graduates (IMG) who are working in rural SA are paid in the same manner as all other GPs in Australia.

IMG employed in rural South Australia are either employed under a Fee for Service Model (FFS) or as Salaried Medical Officers under the Salaried Medical Officers Enterprise Agreement, 2005.

For those employed under FFS, the doctor is paid a fee for each service provided in the rural health service. The services are itemised in the Medicare Benefits Schedule and the fee per service rates are detailed in the South Australian Medical Schedule of Fees.

In addition, all internationally educated nurses and midwives employed in South Australian country health units are employed under the Nurses/Midwives (South Australian Public Sector) Enterprise Agreement 2004.

ELIZABETH GP PLUS HEALTH CARE CENTRE

In reply to Ms CHAPMAN.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that the construction of the Elizabeth GP Plus Health Care Centre should be completed and operational in 2009.

Construction is expected to begin in late 2007, with Government expenditure for the fit-out occurring during 2008 and 2009.

OFFICE FOR THE SOUTHERN SUBURBS

In reply to Hon. I.F. EVANS.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that the key role of the Office for the Southern Suburbs is to work with Government agencies and the Cities of Marion and Onkaparinga to maximise outcomes for the South.

In 2005-06 the Office initially had a staff of four comprising the Director, Administration Officer and two Project Officers. The Director's role primarily focused on economic development and planning issues, whilst the project officers focused on school retention, workforce, graffiti management and community arts initiatives.

In April 2006 the full time staffing of the Office was reduced to the Director and Administration Officer. Project Officer assistance will now only be utilised on a temporary needs basis. Employee benefits and costs therefore accounted for almost half of the Office's budget in 2005-06.

Graffiti management funding is the only major initiative for which the Office is directly responsible. In 2005-06 the Office provided funding to the Cities of Marion and Onkaparinga totalling \$219 275 to undertake an extensive range of graffiti management initiatives and \$30 000 to Carclew Youth Arts centre to manage and undertake a mural artwork for the Noarlunga Theatre that had previously been a graffiti hot spot.

The Office also contributed to the funding of a number of other initiatives such as Leadership Onkaparinga and feasibility studies for Waterproofing the South and the master planning of the old Christies Beach West High School site.

BROADBAND STRATEGY

In reply to Hon. I.F. EVANS.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that a number of other telecommunications companies provide a product similar to Telstra's 3G product (marketed as Next G). 3G type products are good niche products for some individuals and businesses requiring mobile data services.

The broadband strategy that is being developed for the Southern Suburbs has the primary objective of ensuring all residents and businesses are provided with affordable broadband options similar to the fixed broadband service in locations where this is available. Gap analysis has shown that there are still many parts of the southern suburbs that are missing out on basic broadband, that there is a strong market need for it and that 3G mobile technology based services are not offering a similar price and performance capability of the fixed broadband services.

Stage 2 of the broadband study has invited telecommunications companies to tender proposals to meet the gaps in the south at an affordable price. Responses are currently under consideration.

LEADERSHIP ONKAPARINGA

In reply to Hon. I.F. EVANS.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised that the Office for the Southern Suburbs has provided \$30 000 funding to the City of Onkaparinga to run a pilot program called *Leadership Onkaparinga*. The Council has contracted a private provider with extensive experience in community capacity building to run the course.

The pilot program selected twenty applicants, representing a diverse cross section of the community, to participate in a course that is delivered in 10 one-day sessions over six months. On successful completion of the course participants will achieve two national competency units at Certificate IV level. The course work covers strategic thinking and planning, communication skills, managing community projects, influencing change, community leadership and developing community organisations.

ZERO WASTE SA

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: The Minister for Environment and Conservation has been advised:

As advised in my response to the question asked during the estimates hearings, the program was refocussed because it was evident that the community had widely adopted alternatives to single use plastic shopping bags and that the continuing, although much reduced, use of single use bags was largely due to shoppers forgetting to use the alternative bags they owned.

The government remains committed to phasing out plastic bags by the end of 2008.

MINOR WORKS ALLOCATIONS

In reply to **Mr PENGILLY**.

The Hon. J.D. HILL: I am advised:

1. The Allocation of minor works Annual Programs are provided in the table below showing that \$7 023 383 of the allocated \$8 193 000 has been allocated and now commencing procurement processes.

The Department of Health holds a portion of minor works allocations as a contingency until November of each year to cover unexpected infrastructure needs that might arise and then finalises allocation of the remaining funds for approval in December. That process is in place this year with the resolution of the remaining funding of \$1 169 617 currently being resolved.

RAINFOREST TIMBER

In reply to **Mr PISONI**.

The Hon. J.D. LOMAX-SMITH: The budget line referenced by the honourable member does include expenditure by schools on timber. However, the Department of Education and Children's Services does not have detail of expenditures on particular timber purchases of individual schools.

Import and sale of timber is tightly controlled by Australian Government policy and international agreements. As Australia is a member of the international treaty—*The Convention on International Trade of Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES)*, which is administered by the United Nations Environment program, compliance is enforced under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999*, which strictly controls the importation, forestation and use of any endangered timber. Timber suppliers are required under the Act to abide by the regulations.

Meranti is not currently on the CITES list of banned or controlled tree species, which is updated from time to time when a tree species is considered endangered.

However, advice from schools indicates that design and technology teachers are vigilant in regard to issues of sustainability and environmental impact and are mindful that Meranti is a rainforest timber. In addition, the characteristics of the timber are such that it is not considered of suitable quality for most design and technology projects. As such, little if any is currently used in schools. In any instances where it may be used, this is likely to be old stock. The vast bulk of timber purchased by schools is radiata pine.

Given the department's strong stance on environmental conservation, communication will be undertaken with teachers to reinforce that purchase of rainforest timber should be avoided.

SOLAR SCHOOLS PROGRAM

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. J.D. LOMAX-SMITH: Up to 30 June 2006 the total estimated energy generated through the Solar Schools program was of the order of 270 000 kWh, providing cost savings of more than \$45 000. There had also been the associated environmental benefit estimated to be a reduction of approximately 250 tonnes of CO₂ released due to the Solar Schools program.

SCHOOL ZONING

In reply to **Mr PISONI**.

The Hon. J.D. LOMAX-SMITH: It has been normal practice for the Department of Education and Children's Services and its predecessor agencies to use public roadways to define school zones in order to make use of clearly defined and recognised physical features of the landscape.

This is consistent with practice in defining 'zones' for other public purposes, including census collection districts, suburbs, local council areas and electorates.

GRANTS AND SUBSIDIES

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE**.

The Hon. J.D. LOMAX-SMITH: The 2005-06 programs

- *Education—Preschool to Year 12* and
 - *Children's Services*
- were restructured in 2006-07 to
- *Early Years Education and Care (Birth to PreSchool)*
 - *Education—Early Years Education (R-2)* and

MULTICULTURAL GRANTS

The Hon. J.D. LOMAX-SMITH: The Commonwealth multicultural grants increased from 2005-06 to 2006-07 by \$17 000. The budget for the State multicultural grants also increased by \$17 000 from 2005-06 to 2006-07.

The variation between the 2005-06 estimated result of \$913 000 and the 2006-07 budget amount of \$698 000 is mainly due to additional one-off expenditure in 2005-06 relating to a carryover of \$267 000 from 2004-05 for State multicultural grants approved in 2004-05 but paid in 2005-06.

LICENCE INFORMATION PACKS

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD: I am advised that where a personal enquiry is made at a Business Enterprise Centre, a licence information pack is usually provided on a 'while-you-wait' basis. Telephone requests are usually posted on a 'same-day' or 'next-day' basis. Where packs are posted, delivery time is in the hands of the postal service.

BUSINESS ENTERPRISE CENTRES

In reply to Mr PISONI.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD: I am advised the licence packages are prepared and provided by Business Enterprise Centres and by the Department of Trade and Economic Development by reference to the Business Licence Information Service. Business owners apply directly to the relevant Government, Local Government or Private Licensing Agencies. It is not practice for the Centres or the Department of Trade and Economic Development to follow up whether or not the person in receipt of the information actually applies for a licence. Statistics of follow-up phone calls are not recorded.

GOULBURN MURRAY WATER RECOVERY PACKAGE

In reply to Mr PEDERICK.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD:

1. I am advised that South Australia has agreed to invest the \$12.09 million over 4 years as follows:

2005-06	\$ 807 000
2006-07	\$4 121 000
2007-08	\$3 581 000
2008-09	\$3 581 000

The investment of \$12.09 million by South Australia will contribute to an overall investment of \$93 million. Victoria guarantees 145 GL of savings for the \$93 million investment, well below the nominal \$1 million per gigalitre threshold identified for water recovery projects under Clause 36 of The Living Murray Business Plan. The investment will result in:

- The creation of a new lower-reliability entitlement, but with greater reliability to the current 'sales water'. This will require the creation of legislation, a water register, improvements to the Eildon Dam and irrigation headworks before the water saving to the environment can be made. Twenty per cent of this entitlement will be allocated to the environment averaging 120 GL per year.
- Provision for a 25 GL high reliability entitlement to the environment through savings from more sustainable and efficient irrigation water supply systems.

The water recovery project is divided into 14 milestones. The Investor Board must agree on the completion of milestones before payments can be made. South Australia is a member of the Investor Board. To date South Australia has invested the first instalment of \$807 000.

2. Yes. As explained in Parliament, the Goulburn Murray package is an investment package over a period of time and intends to deliver water by 2009. The earliest we can expect water from this package would be in the 2008-2009 financial year. While no water has been recovered to date, the package will recover 145 GL of water overall for the environment. This water will be held on a licence and made available to the Living Murray initiative to be used in accordance with the Living Murray Environmental Watering Plan as agreed by partner jurisdictions.

SUPPLIES AND SERVICES

In reply to **Mr PEDERICK**.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD: I am advised the major variation in the supplies and services budget of approximately \$3 million may be attributed to the timing impact of carryovers. Carryovers from 2005-06 into 2006-07 and later years will have the effect of reducing the 2005-06 estimated result (ie revised budget) and increasing the amount of expenditure for the latter years.

Carryovers will also have a corresponding impact on the comparison between 2005-06 and 2004-05 financial years.

During 2005-06, carryovers of \$4.425 million were approved into latter years. This had the effect of reducing the 2005-06 estimated result for supplies and services. Of this amount, \$2.425 million was approved for carryover into 2006-07, with the remainder being carried over into the 2007-08 financial year.

In the absence of the carryover, the estimated result for goods and services would have been higher.

RIVER MURRAY LEVY

In reply to **Mr PEDERICK**.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD: I am advised that for 2005-06 a total of \$3.9 million from the Save the River Murray Fund was spent on Infrastructure Services (River Murray). The works funded were:

- \$3.6 million towards South Australia's contribution to the Murray-Darling Basin Commission, which in turn assisted in the financing of such investment projects as salt interception schemes, construction of fishways (together with modification of navigable passes to improve Occupational Health and Safety) and dredging at the Murray Mouth.
- \$0.2 million on upgrading the Swan Reach Waste Disposal Station, preparing a concept design for a new waste disposal station at Walker Flat and various improvements on various other waste disposal stations along South Australia's section of the River Murray to reduce black water pollution by houseboats.
- \$0.1 million on the maintenance of Riverland drainage disposal systems ensuring that the system continues to operate and to prevent an escalation in operating costs.

SUPPLIES AND SERVICES

In reply to **Mr PEDERICK**.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD: I am advised the increase in the budget for goods and services in 2006-07 over the 2005-06 financial

year can be attributed to timing issues associated with approved carryovers.

The approval of carryovers during 2005-06 into 2006-07 and 2007-08 has had the effect of reducing the estimated result for 2005-06 and increasing the budget for 2006-07 and 2007-08.

During 2005-06, carryovers of \$4.425 million were approved into the subsequent years. The budget for 2005-06 was reduced by this amount. The impact of the carryover explains the major differential between the 2005-06 and 2006-07 financial years.

In reply to **Mr PEDERICK**.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD:

1. I am advised the variances between the 2005-06 budget for employee benefits and costs and the 2005-06 estimated result and the 2006-07 budget on the whole attribute to the recognition of costs associated with external revenues primarily from the Murray-Darling Basin Commission.

During the latter part of 2005-06, the Department sought to more accurately reflect the impact of external revenues not previously factored into budget figures and thereby provide more accurate budget estimates for 2005-06 and future years. The necessary journals were processed by the Department of Treasury and Finance during 2005-06. As is shown, the estimated result for 2005-06 is now more comparable with the 2006-07 budget.

2. The increase to the 2005-06 estimated result reflects an adjustment to the budget to take account of external revenues rather than the hiring of additional staff. This is reflected in the 2004-05 actual expenditure on employee benefits and costs.

SALT INTERCEPTION SCHEME CONTRACTORS

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD: I am advised that the Department of Water, Land and Biodiversity Conservation are responsible for developing a range of salinity reduction measures that comply with both the Murray-Darling Basin Salinity Management Strategy and the South Australian State Salinity Strategy. These measures include the planning and implementation of Salt Interception Schemes (SIS).

One such scheme has just been opened at Bookpurnong, one is currently under construction at Loxton, the Murtho Scheme is with the Murray-Darling Basin Commission for approval and investigations are being carried out for future schemes at Pike River, Waikerie and Salt Creek. The Department also undertakes an on-going program of measuring in-river salinities to determine where changes/increases in salt loads to the river are occurring as potential sites for further schemes.

The work associated with the investigations, design and construction of these Salt Interception Schemes is carried out using a combination of in-house skills and specialist contractors. In 2005-06, \$850 000 was spent on contractors providing specialist information on hydrogeology, hydraulic design, cultural heritage clearances, vegetation assessments and preparation of technical documentation. A further \$2.8 million was spent on contractors to construct on-ground works.

BUSINESS CLOSURES

In reply to **Mr PISONI**.

In reply to **Mrs PENFOLD**.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD: I am advised at 1 July, 2005 the total number of registered business names in South Australia was 95 442. At 30 June, 2006 the figure was 96 049. During the year 13 267 names were removed from the register by business proprietors themselves or the by the Registrar. (*Office of Consumer and Business Affairs*)

The number of people employed full and part time in South Australia at August 2005 was 736 700 (*ABS 6105.0 Australian Labour Market Statistics October 2005*) and the number employed at August 2006 was 749 700. (*ABS 6105.0 Australian Labour Market Statistics, October 2006*)

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) does not separate employment statistics by business size. The ABS does not keep statistics on number of jobs lost as a result of business closures.

Statistics for business-related bankruptcies in South Australia over the past three years are 283 for 2003-04, 248 for 2004-05 and 287 for 2005-06.

SECONDED STAFF

In reply to **Mr WILLIAMS**.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD: I am advised that during 2005-06 a total of three officers were on secondments to positions outside the Science and Innovation and Information Economy directorates. One was working in an administrative unit within DFEEST, one at the University of Adelaide and the other at the University of South Australia.

There were no staff seconded to the directorates from other agencies.

SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY AND INNOVATION

In reply to **Mr WILLIAMS**.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD: The Minister for Industry and Trade has provided the following information:

The Science, Technology and Innovation Directorate of the Department of Further Education, Employment, Science and Technology, BioInnovation SA and Playford Capital are specifically targeted at science, technology and innovation.

The Venture Capital Board (VCB) was charged with “developing an active, growing and sustainable South Australian private equity sector that will positively influence innovation and development in the local business sector” (refer 2.53 and 2.55 of budget papers).

That is, a focus on the complete private equity sector, not just science, technology and innovation, but clearly incorporating those sectors.

Whilst no money has been specifically targeted at ‘science, technology and innovation’, all of the VCB activities incorporate businesses and entrepreneurs in the science and technology sectors. For example, around two thirds of all attendees at the VCB Equity Ready workshops over the past 12 months have been from businesses with science or technology based products or services.

In addition, all three of the investments by the Paragon Private Equity Fund 1, managed by Paragon Advisory, in which the government, via the VCB, is an investor, have been in South Australian based technology based companies, namely: KEE Technologies, Bresagen and NuKorc, for a total investment of around \$6 million. The current government commitment of \$5.4 million in the Paragon Private Equity Fund 1 represents around 25 per cent of the total fund size.

The VCB is not a direct investor, or provider of grants, in any individual company. The investment criteria governing the types and details of any investment by the Paragon Private Equity Fund 1 are documented in accordance with the government’s requirements. Other than ensuring that this investment criteria is adhered to, along with other investors the government/VCB has no say in individual investment decisions.

SKILLED MIGRATION FIGURES

In reply to **Mr PISONI**.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD: I am advised the South Australian Government does not possess settler arrival data by age or by primary and secondary applicants. I am however able to provide data provided by DIMA on visas granted in 2005-06. These data give an indication of the age profile and the number of dependants associated with each visa class. These figures are slightly different to settler arrivals, as there can be a time lag between a visa being granted and the person arriving in Australia.

The Hon. J.M. RANKINE: The allocation of State funding for the European Wasp Control Program was \$70 000 in 2004-05 and \$70 000 in 2005-06.

MAJOR INFRASTRUCTURE ISSUES

In reply to **Mr PENGILLY**.

The Hon. J.M. RANKINE: Major infrastructure issues, as well as matters which impact on infrastructure, currently being considered by the Minister's State/Local Government Forum (other than stormwater management and flood mitigation) are Community

Wastewater Management Systems (formerly STEDS), and the Strategic Infrastructure Plan. Also being considered is the Housing Plan for South Australia, regional waste management initiatives, and the Financial Sustainability Program of the Local Government Association, which includes asset management and infrastructure issues.

YOUTH ADVISORY COMMITTEES

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. P. CAICA: The Office for Youth's funding for 2005-06 for YACSA totalled \$261 500. In addition, the Office for Youth provided YACSA with two excess second hand desktop computers which totalled \$2 000.

In June 2006, the Office for Youth signed a tri-annual funding agreement with YACSA comprising core funding of \$265 000 per year, committing funding until 30 June 2009.

CORPORATE SERVICES

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. P. CAICA: The costs and full-time equivalent staffing numbers identified are those considered to be the normal recurrent operating costs and FTE's of the function for 2005-06 and exclude items funded through the capital program such as the purchase of computers and other one-off funding. Administrative support staff costs within educational workgroups in TAFE Institutes have not been included.

SUMMARY INCOME STATEMENT

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

In both cases the reduction in revenue in the 'other' budget line is due to the change in reporting method. Commonwealth Natural Heritage Trust funds are received by Regional Natural Resource Management Boards, who then direct the funds to DEH (and other State Departments and private groups). In previous years this revenue has been reported as State funded, however, for the purposes

of the Portfolio Statement, it was seen as being preferable to report this revenue as Commonwealth. This, in part, also explains the increase in Commonwealth revenue in the same table.

GRANTS AND SUBSIDIES

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

The reduction of \$942 000 in the 2005-06 Budget to \$26 000 in the 2005-06 Estimated Result arises from a change in reporting classification from Grant Expenditure to Services and Supplies Expenditure.

In previous years, this expenditure has been reported as Grant expenditure, however, for the purposes of the Portfolio Statement, it was seen as being more appropriate to report this expenditure as Services and Supplies.

In conjunction with this re-categorisation of expenditure, the lower estimated result in 2005-06 largely reflects the carryover of expenditure initially budgeted in 2005-06 to 2006-07 for the Adelaide Living Beaches initiative and the Living Coast Strategy (approximately \$1 million in aggregate).

As can be seen from the Portfolio Statement total budgeted expenditure during 2006-07 is approximately \$3 million higher than the 2005-06 estimated result. This increase reflects the \$1 million carryovers referred to above, as well as an additional \$1.5 million for the Living Coast Strategy (Marine Parks and Planning) and a further \$0.650 million (approximately) for the Adelaide Living Beaches initiative.

MARINE PARKS CONSULTATION

In reply to **Mr PISONI**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

The following groups were consulted prior to the development of the marine parks legislation through their representation on the Marine Park Stakeholder Reference Group:

- the Conservation Council of South Australia;
- the Wilderness Society (SA) Branch;
- the South Australian Recreation Fishing Advisory Council;
- the South Australian Aquaculture Council;
- the Seafood Council (SA) Ltd;

BOTANIC GARDENS WATER RESTRICTIONS

In reply to **Mr PENGILLY**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I been advised:

The Adelaide Botanic Gardens are subject to the same water restrictions as other users in metropolitan Adelaide except for a general exemption which applies to open space areas and a specific exemption negotiated with SA Water.

The general exemption allows for watering on Mondays, as with all irrigated public space areas.

The specific negotiated concession to the level 2 restrictions allows the Adelaide Botanic Gardens to water until 9:00 am. This

concession only applies to the operation of the Garden's manually operated systems, which can only be operated when staff are present. Staff have been rostered to start at 6:00 a.m. to commence watering earlier and to have it completed by the negotiated 9:00 a.m. deadline.

ZERO WASTE SA

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

The reduction of budget dollars for supplies and services and grants and subsidies between 2005-06 budget and 2006-07 budget is attributed to a one-off carryover of expenditure authority from 2004-05 to 2005-06 of \$2.165 million and that the expenditure budget for 2006-07 has been set to a level that reflects Zero Waste SA's income capacity for the current financial year.

PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

The Zero Waste SA \$340 000 cash outflow in property, plant and equipment in the estimated result for 2005-06 is related to the design and construction of the Zero Waste SA green fit out at level 8, Statewide House, 99 Gawler Place, Adelaide. The expenditure is attributed to a number of items such as design plan, risk management and construction costs, new workstations, office furniture, office equipment, as well as installation of energy efficient light fittings.

The investment of \$340 000 was not shown in the 2005-06 budget as it was included in the operational expenditure budget for Zero Waste SA (under the supplies and services line) as the green fit out did not become an investment until the contract for the design and construction work was substantially completed in January 2006. A Treasury journal was processed in January 2006 to realign the expenditure budget from operational to investment.

KILBURN, PM10 LEVELS

In reply to **Mr HANNA**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

In responding to this question it needs to be highlighted that the monitoring of PM10 levels was only one of 9 different pollutant types monitored as part of the study that included monitoring at Kilburn and Gepps Cross as well as the odour snapshot and the audits of the 15 EPA licensed premises.

An estimated \$15 000 was spent on monitoring of PM10 in the Kilburn area, which compares to \$390 000 spent across the State for the equivalent period.

In calculating the amount spent on the PM10 monitoring, estimations have been made in regards to issues such as officers' salaries, use of equipment and goods and services, which all need to be considered to ensure a true representation of costs are included. Depreciation of equipment has not been considered.

Calculations for State spending were conducted by using the annual budget for air monitoring and averaging that out to determine one day's equivalent, which was then multiplied by 83, the number of monitoring days for the Kilburn study.

ANIMAL AND PLANT CONTROL COMMISSION

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

Due to statutory authority status and government reporting requirements, the June 2005 figures did not include employees of the Animal and Plant Control Commission (APCC), amounting to 27.61 full time equivalent staff (FTEs). These employees were regarded as seconded to the Animal and Plant Control Commission and were reported separately to the Minister. Upon implementation of the Natural Resources Management Act 2004 in January 2006, these employees became part of DWLBC. In June 2006 the APCC employed 34.3 FTEs. FTE reductions in other divisions within NRM Services meant that the overall increase to the agency was 29 FTEs.

The estimated growth in FTE number for DWLBC in 2006-07 financial year, and the location of these new positions is as follows:

15 FTE are expected to join the Infrastructure and Business Division and will be funded through:

- National Action Plan for Salinity and Water Quality
- Murray-Darling Basin Commission
- National Heritage Trust
- River Murray Improvement Program

Up to 11 new FTEs are to be employed by the Resource Allocation Division during 2006-07 to work on NWI funded projects, with up to 8 of these located in the South East and up to 3 located in Adelaide.

NRM CONFERENCE

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

The inaugural State NRM conference will be held under the auspices of the recently established NRM Volunteer Committee.

The Department of Water, Land and Biodiversity Conservation will help fund the conference as well as providing staffing support to coordinate the organisation of the conference. It is anticipated that sponsorship will also be sought from other parties.

Conference details and costs have not yet been determined. One of the first tasks for the Committee will be to develop a work plan, including preparation of a business case for the State NRM conference setting out intended audience, anticipated cost, options for sponsorship, location and timing.

The NRM Volunteer Committee was established in October 2006 as a sub-committee of the State NRM Council and replaces the South Australian Landcare Committee.

The committee has been specifically asked to address mechanisms to recognise effort and contributions of NRM volunteers and to ensure that processes and procedures are in place to build the capacity of the NRM volunteer sector, including through convening statewide forums and conferences.

WATER SUPPLY

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

The Department of Water, Land and Biodiversity Conservation does not own the unallocated water.

Currently there is unallocated water within the Minister's reserve. It was reserved from the unallocated water held by the Crown by the former Minister for Water Resources in September 2001.

Under existing legislation, the water cannot be sold, only leased.

Prices would be dependent on the market price prevailing at the time. The market price typically depends on the quality of the water and area in which the water is located.

There may also be unallocated water in other areas of the State that could become available.

WATER, LAND AND BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION COMMISSION

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

The increase in the budget for general supplies and services from \$37.612 million in 2005 to \$50.375 million in 2006-07 (by \$12.763 million) has principally to do with timing differences arising from the impact of carryover journals from one year to the next and a \$0.5 million election commitment for rainwater tank rebates. In the absence of these factors, the difference between the two years is not regarded to be material.

Carryovers will impact budget figures by reducing the previous year's budget and, for unconditionally approved carryovers, increasing the subsequent year's budget. The assessed impact of carryovers from 2005-06 into 2006-07 is in the order of \$7.9 million (ie the 2006-07 budget is higher by this amount over and above the 2005-06 financial year budget). Further, reversals of carryovers from the 2004-05 financial year accounted for an additional variance of \$3.7 million. The validity of these adjustments has been confirmed by the Department of Treasury and Finance in the Department's 2005-06 end of year review, which was conducted recently.

After discounting for these amounts, the difference between the two years is relatively negligible. Other variations will reflect the timing of various expenditures associated with major projects, most of which have a significant component of external funding (eg National Action Plan for Salinity and Water Quality).

INCOME STATEMENT AND SHARED SERVICES REFORMS

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

In my answer of this question on 25 October 2006, I referred to service level agreements of \$3.5 million with DAIS. Whilst the total amount was correct, some of these agreements are in fact held by PIRSA. The cost of the corporate services DWLBC retains through service level agreements with the Department of Administrative and Information Services was \$2.1 million in 2005-06. In addition, there

were service level agreements with Primary Industries and Resources of \$1.4m in 2005-06 covering IT facilities, technical advice and field services.

COMMONWEALTH REVENUE

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS**.

The Hon. G.E. GAGO: I have been advised:

Commonwealth revenues increased primarily due to increased revenues from the Commonwealth Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry in relation to the Branched Broomrape Eradication Program. These revenues were \$2.106 million in 2005-06. Other, more minor increases occurred in revenues from the Natural Heritage Trust program and CRC for Plant Based Management of Dryland Salinity.
