#### CONSULTANTS AND CONTRACTORS

In reply to various members (25-27 June, 30 June, 1 and 2 July 2008).

**The Hon. M.D. RANN (Ramsay—Premier, Minister for Economic Development, Minister for Social Inclusion, Minister for the Arts, Minister for Sustainability and Climate Change):** This question has been asked of all ministers during the 2008 Estimates Committees.

The following information is provided on behalf of all ministers:

The Department of the Premier and Cabinet circulars PC013—annual reporting requirements and PC027—disclosure of government contracts covers all payments to consultants and large payments to contractors.

The annual report shows all payments to consultants and the nature of their work.

Contract disclosure requires certain information about contracts to be published on the tenders SA website:

- Contract title;
- Contractor's details;
- Start and end date of the contract;
- Contract value;
- Procurement process used.

The contract disclosure requirements apply to all consultancy contracts (regardless of value) and other goods and services contracts where the value of the contract is more than \$500,000.

#### BUDGET UNDERSPENDING

**The Hon. K.O. FOLEY (Port Adelaide—Deputy Premier, Treasurer, Minister for Industry and Trade, Minister for Federal/State Relations):** I am advised that the enclosed table lists the estimate of 2007-08 underspending against the approved budget and carryovers that have been approved and already reflected in the expenditure figures for 2008-09. Carryovers approved into financial years beyond 2008-09 are not included in the table. The estimated level of underspending is measured by requests submitted by agencies to carryover expenditure to 2008-09 and future years as part of the 2008-09 budget process.

### SHARED SERVICES

In reply to various members (25-27 June 2008).

**The Hon. K.O. FOLEY (Port Adelaide—Deputy Premier, Treasurer, Minister for Industry and Trade, Minister for Federal/State Relations):** I am advised that an across government collection of baseline data relating to agency corporate and business support services was undertaken in March 2007, using 2005-06 data.

Agencies provided a broad range of information relating to their corporate governance arrangements, including activity levels, volumes, costs and resources involved in the delivery of corporate and business support services during 2005-06.

The data has assisted in determining a shared services model suitable for implementation in the South Australian public sector.

Since the data was collected, agencies have continued to make changes to their corporate support functions, services and systems and hence, significant effort is expended by Shared Services SA during pre-transition and general discovery processes to gather more targeted and detailed information relating to in-scope services. As a result, some of the initial services where baseline data was collected have not been included, whilst the in-scope service designs have been refined and finalised.

To release 2005-06 agency baseline data now would misrepresent the current status of data collection could be misleading. Therefore, there is no plan to release it.

### POLICE HEADQUARTERS

In reply to **Mrs REDMOND (Heysen)** (26 June 2008).

In reply to **Mr PENGILLY (Finniss)** (1 July 2008).

**The Hon. P. HOLLOWAY (Minister for Mineral Resources Development, Minister for Urban Development and Planning, Minister for Small Business):** The approved investing budget for the relocation of the police headquarters is for \$18.5 million in the 2010-11 financial year and for \$20.2 million in the 2011-12 financial year.

The approved investing budget equals \$38.7 million as included in page 7 of the Treasurer's speech.

There will be a part year recurrent budget impact in 2011-12 when SAPOL relocates from the existing police headquarters premises when the lease expires in February 2012.

There is currently an approach to the market via a registration of interest. However, at this early stage of the project it is not possible or appropriate to provide what the recurrent impact is for 2011-12 or from 2012-13, beyond the four year budget cycle.

#### **POLICE SECURITY SERVICES BRANCH**

In reply to **Mrs REDMOND (Heysen)** (26 June 2008).

**The Hon. P. HOLLOWAY (Minister for Mineral Resources Development, Minister for Urban Development and Planning, Minister for Small Business):** Police Security Services Branch provides security equipment maintenance services to government agencies on a cost recovery basis. In 2004 South Australia Police undertook a full public tender process to engage a service provider for these services. Through that process, Australian Integrated Security (AIS), a proprietary limited company, was selected. A contract for three years (with an option to extend for a further two years) was awarded to AIS and commenced in 2005. AIS provides these services across South Australia. In some regional areas, these services are sub-contracted. The contract includes provisions for probity checking and disclosure of employee information to the Minister. AIS has advised that it has no employees who were previously employed by the South Australian Government within the last two years.

#### **CRIME GANGS TASK FORCE, IT PROJECT**

In reply to **Mrs REDMOND (Heysen)** (26 June 2008).

**The Hon. P. HOLLOWAY (Minister for Mineral Resources Development, Minister for Urban Development and Planning, Minister for Small Business):** The approved budget for the crime gangs taskforce computer system includes \$5.181 million for capital expenditure over the next five years. There is also a recurrent budget allocated to this project for one civilian FTE to administer the system and for the purchase of IT equipment. The IT equipment includes servers, database licenses and software.

The approved recurrent budget for this system over the next four years, as published in Budget paper 3, Budget statement, page 2.15 is \$0.695 million.

Therefore, the total approved funding for this initiative is \$5.876 million, reflected in the rounded announcement of \$5.9 million.

#### **CANNABIS CULTIVATION**

In reply to **Mr KOUTSANTONIS (West Torrens)** (26 June 2008).

**The Hon. P. HOLLOWAY (Minister for Mineral Resources Development, Minister for Urban Development and Planning, Minister for Small Business):** Historically, ETSA Utilities was the single entity in the supply of electricity and as a government agency/instrumentality relevant information was provided in accord with Section 4 (10) Cabinet Administrative Instruction No 1 of 1989 otherwise referred to as Information Privacy Principles Instruction.

This facilitated SAPOL in requesting electricity supply information from a central repository within a recognised state government information release framework. However, when the deregulation (privatisation) of the electricity industry occurred the instruction became less relevant.

The National Privacy Principles, Schedule 3, Privacy Act 1988 (Cth) permits the disclosure of personal information to a relevant organisation on the condition the organisation has reason to



suspect that unlawful activity has or is being engaged in and the information is required as a necessary part of the investigation.

Whilst legislation permits the provision of personal information, there is no legal requirement for them to do so and there is no penalty for failure to do so.

Requests to suppliers of electricity are assessed on an individual basis and in requesting the information the investigating officer would be in possession of information to indicate the premises (occupied or otherwise) are being utilised for the cultivation of cannabis.

SAPOL maintains a working relationship with electricity suppliers and despite no legal requirement to do so, information is provided to SAPOL upon request for the purposes of investigating criminal activity.

#### **CRIME GANGS TASK FORCE, IT PROJECT**

In reply to **Mrs REDMOND (Heysen)** (26 June 2008).

**The Hon. P. HOLLOWAY (Minister for Mineral Resources Development, Minister for Urban Development and Planning, Minister for Small Business):** The approved outlaw motorcycle gang task force information technology system will involve several components. These will include the purchase of a commercial software product that supports the business requirements of the new legislation, upgrading infrastructure and enhancements to current SAPOL systems and developing essential interfacing capability between the new commercial software product and existing SAPOL computer systems.

The investing capital costs for the four year period is \$4.551 million. The project will take five years with investing capital costs of \$5.181 million.

The operating costs are for one civilian FTE to administer the system and for the purchase of IT equipment. The IT equipment includes servers, database licenses and software. The yearly breakdown is:

#### **WIND FARMS**

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS (Goyder)** (26 June 2008).

**The Hon. P. HOLLOWAY (Minister for Mineral Resources Development, Minister for Urban Development and Planning, Minister for Small Business):** The Myponga/Sellicks Hill wind farm is the only wind farm to have been assessed and approved as a major development under the Development Act. Initially lodged as a Crown Development, the application was directed to be assessed as a major development in August 2002, prior to the introduction of appropriate policies into development plans to guide the assessment of wind farms in South Australia. In July 2003, the then Minister for Urban Development and Planning, the Hon Jay Weatherill MP, approved the Wind Farms Plan Amendment Report which inserted appropriate wind farm policies into all development plans across the state, which has since provided a suitable policy base for council assessments of wind farms. I believe that the planning processes for wind farms in South Australia has worked very well as South Australia is now the leader in wind farm developments in Australia.

Minister for Police

In 2006-07 SAPOL paid \$3,000 grant funding to the Australian Crime Prevention Council. The grant funding was used in the support of the Australian Crime Prevention Council as a national body. No grant funding was provided to the Australian Crime Prevention Council during 2007-08.

Grant funding in 2006-07 and 2007-08 of \$97,000 and \$99,000 respectively were paid to Safer Communities Australia Inc. This grant funding was used for expenses related to raising awareness about public safety and the recruitment of new volunteers.

In accordance with Treasurer's Instruction (TI) 15 (reissued 14 November 2007), a written agreement setting out the terms and conditions associated with grant funding paid to the ACPC and SCA is required. Grant agreements were established in 2007-08 with both organisations.

The Office for the Southern Suburbs did not provide any financial assistance in 2007-08 towards regional initiatives, rather the director and contract staff of the Office for the Southern Suburbs gave their time in terms of in kind support, by facilitating linkages between the region and government agencies.

As mentioned in estimates on 1 July 2008 the director is the member of various reference and working groups such as the Southern Employment Skills Formation Network, which guides SA Works spending in the region and the working group that guided the development of the Southern Adelaide Workforce Development Strategy. The director is working closely with the two councils on this important issue and a stakeholder workshop focussing on implementation of the strategy, sponsored by the Office for the Southern Suburbs, is scheduled for 31 July 2008.

In addition the director has provided input into section 30 reviews and other planning issues to both myself and the councils on a needs basis.

More recently the staff of the Office for the Southern Suburbs have played a critical executive assistance role to the Southern Suburbs Coordination Group that is responding to the announced closure of Mitsubishi at Tonsley Park.

### CONTAMINATED WATER

In reply to **Ms CHAPMAN (Bragg—Deputy Leader of the Opposition)** (1 July 2008).

**The Hon. J.D. HILL (Kaurna—Minister for Health, Minister for the Southern Suburbs, Minister Assisting the Premier in the Arts):** I have been advised:

1.&2. The issuing of health alerts is done in accordance with established public health principles, the basis of which is a thorough assessment of the level of risk to the public. Not all contaminated sites pose an immediate threat to public health.

In relation to the General Motors-Holden (GMH) Woodville site, the Department of Health was notified in 2001 that chromium and petroleum hydrocarbons had been detected in shallow groundwater beneath the SA Manufacturing Park at 853-867 Port Road. Chromium was reported to be detected at concentrations exceeding the Australian Drinking Water Guideline value in some of the monitoring bores located on this site. The groundwater flow in the area is in the westerly direction. No chromium was detected in an off-site monitoring bore located down-gradient, approximately 50 metres to the west of the western site boundary.

A portion of the GMH site has been redeveloped for a commercial bulk-goods activity (Bunning's warehouse). The site is bounded by industry and a cemetery to the west, a racecourse to the north and mixed residential-industrial areas to the east and south. A search of registered bores recorded in the Department of Land, Water and Biodiversity Conservation drill hole enquiry system identified several bores within a one kilometre radius of the site. The only down-gradient registered bore in close proximity to the site is a drainage bore which is not used to extract water. There are some registered bores located to the south-east which are up-gradient (upstream of the groundwater flow) of the site.

Based on the flow characteristics of the groundwater and the location of residences, it was deemed that there was little risk to human health from chromium contamination of shallow groundwater at this site and no public health warning was issued by the then Department of Human Services.

The Department of Health recommends as a matter of course, that bore water is not to be used for drinking, cooking or watering edible plants without testing to prove suitability. Shallow unconfined (that is, bores that extract water from aquifers that are not confined between layers of impervious rock or clay) bores are the most susceptible to contamination and are not recommended for domestic use.

**The Hon. J.D. HILL (Kaurna—Minister for Health, Minister for the Southern Suburbs, Minister Assisting the Premier in the Arts):** I have been advised:

The statewide clinical networks were established to develop clinical leadership and plan for the future to ensure services are provided across the continuum of care.

Advice from the clinical networks does not specifically focus on savings relating to procurement of goods and services, although some efficiencies may be released through the service plans developed.

#### **MARJORIE JACKSON-NELSON HOSPITAL**

In reply to **Ms CHAPMAN (Bragg—Deputy Leader of the Opposition)** (1 July 2008).

**The Hon. J.D. HILL (Kaurna—Minister for Health, Minister for the Southern Suburbs, Minister Assisting the Premier in the Arts):** I have been advised:

The government announced that the MJNH will be delivered by a public private partnership (PPP) process. The PPP process is in the early stages and will soon be engaging the market place. In collaboration with the market place, the design of the hospital will be derived over the coming year. As part of that process, the design elements will be determined.

#### **REGIONAL DATA PROJECT**

In reply to **Mr PENGILLY (Finniss)** (1 July 2008).

**The Hon. J.D. HILL (Kaurna—Minister for Health, Minister for the Southern Suburbs, Minister Assisting the Premier in the Arts):** I have been advised:

The collection and dissemination of regional data has been identified by the Office for the Southern Suburbs, the Southern Adelaide Economic Development Board and the cities of Marion and Onkaparinga as an important priority to support regional initiatives.

In 2007-08 the office, in collaboration with the cities of Marion and Onkaparinga purchased REMPLAN economic modelling data from Compelling Economics. The office purchased the regional data set for southern Adelaide including Mitcham and Holdfast Bay at a cost of \$6,370. The cities of Marion and Onkaparinga purchased their individual data sets and their combined data set. All parties share their data.

That data along with ABS census data for the region will be used to develop regional fact sheets in 2008-09. The information will be available electronically on the office's revised web site in late 2008.

Regional data collection and dissemination will be an ongoing activity of the office.

#### ROYAL FLYING DOCTOR SERVICE

In reply to **Ms CHAPMAN (Bragg—Deputy Leader of the Opposition)** (1 July 2008).

**The Hon. J.D. HILL (Kaurna—Minister for Health, Minister for the Southern Suburbs, Minister Assisting the Premier in the Arts):** I have been advised:

Assessments of low acuity level 4 cases has been altered by SAAS. These low acuity cases are managed by SAAS patient transport services.

The change has no impact on billing or charges or clinical outcomes for the patients. High acuity RFDS cases will still receive an emergency ambulance crew as required and this will therefore not impact the clinical outcome for patients.

#### ROAD SAFETY

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE (Morphett)** (1 July 2008).

**The Hon. CARMEL ZOLLO (Minister for Correctional Services, Minister for Road Safety, Minister for Gambling, Minister Assisting the Minister for Multicultural Affairs):** I am advised:

The increase in expected expiation revenue referred to in Budget Paper 3 page 2.22 relates to a new road safety initiative which involves the installation of an additional 20 fixed road safety cameras over the next four years, at the rate of five cameras per annum commencing during 2008-09. The increased revenue will be collected by South Australia Police and the Courts Administration Authority.

This government is improving road safety by implementing a package of measures which target behaviour through education and advertising, legislative change, penalties and enforcement by South Australia Police.

Since coming to government we have more than doubled expenditure on road safety education campaigns, now delivered by the Motor Accident Commission and a number of these campaigns have specifically targeted inattention, fatigue, drink driving and speeding—all factors which may contribute to red light running across the road network.

Each campaign is timed to coincide with SAPOL enforcement targeting the same behaviour, which has been shown to maximise the impact of campaign messages.

#### BROADBAND CONNECTIONS

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS (Goyder)** (30 June 2008).

**The Hon. P. CAICA (Colton—Minister for Industrial Relations, Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education, Minister for Science and Information Economy, Minister for Youth, Minister for Volunteers):** The numbers of broadband connections, in the three regions mentioned, made to date by the respective providers who implemented the BDF supported projects include:

- Coorong (Agile/Internode)—635 services;
- Barossa and Light (Amcom)—74 services; and

- Yorke Peninsula (Agile/Internode)—788 services (including Stages 1 and 2).

### EMPLOYMENT FIGURES

In reply to **Mr GRIFFITHS (Goyder)** (30 June 2008).

**The Hon. P. CAICA (Colton—Minister for Industrial Relations, Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education, Minister for Science and Information Economy, Minister for Youth, Minister for Volunteers):** Employment in South Australia has been increasing for fifteen consecutive months and is at an historical high of 778,400.

Between March 2002 and June 2008, approximately 88,000 jobs have been created in South Australia. This is equivalent to a rate of jobs growth of 12.8 per cent.

That the national rate of jobs growth has been significantly influenced by strong rates of employment growth in Queensland (26.0 per cent since March 2002) and Western Australia (20.8 per cent).

Over the past year to June 2008, employment in South Australia has increased by 20,700 or 2.8 per cent. This is notably higher than the national rate of jobs growth for the same period (2.4 per cent).

### OUTBACK CONNECT

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE (Morphett)** (30 June 2008).

**The Hon. P. CAICA (Colton—Minister for Industrial Relations, Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education, Minister for Science and Information Economy, Minister for Youth, Minister for Volunteers):** At the conclusion of the original Outback Connect program for very remote areas in November 2007 (June 2005–November 2007), \$200,000 was provided by Adult Community Education to continue the program and to extend it to all non-Metropolitan areas of the state.

The major costs were salaries for project coordination and technical support, and the cost of training delivery. Other expenditure included developing and maintaining the software platform for delivery of the program, and promotional costs.

When the Adult Community Education funding agreement concluded in June 2008, Outback Connect had 1250 clients, had delivered 1094.5 training hours and was experiencing significant upward growth in demand for the program, with a corresponding reduction in per capita costs.

A further \$200,000 has been allocated in the Information Economy Directorate budget to extend Outback Connect from July 2008 until June 2009, in response to current demand, and to make the program available to other target areas.
