OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS CARE

In reply to **Mr PISONI (Unley)** (26 June 2009).

The Hon. J.W. WEATHERILL (Cheltenham—Minister for Environment and Conservation, Minister for Early Childhood Development, Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and Reconciliation, Minister Assisting the Premier in Cabinet Business and Public Sector Management): I am advised:

Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) provides an important service to families across the state.

Figures from the Department of Education, Employment & Workplace Relations (DEEWR) indicate that 21,732 families in South Australia used OSHC in the December quarter, 2008.

In South Australia there are 202 OSHC services operated by school governing councils.

For the period ending 31 December 2008, 49 OSHC services recorded an operating loss, of which the majority recorded an operating loss of less than \$10,000.

These figures are a snapshot in time and may not be an accurate reflection of the true financial position. For example, some services hold Child Care Benefit funds in a separate holding account until they are acquitted, which results in revenue being understated.

OSHC services operated by school or governing councils are provided on a fee for service basis, and do not receive operational funding from the state government. Services are funded through a combination of the fees paid for care and Australian Government funding through the Child Care Benefit and Child Care Tax Rebate. Some targeted funding for services that provide care to children with special needs or a disability are provided through the Intervac program.

The Department of Education and Children's Services does not maintain a centralised record for unpaid fees. Each service is responsible for ensuring that appropriate policies are in place that cover all operational matters, including fee collection processes.

APY TASK FORCE

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE (Morphett)** (26 June 2009).

The Hon. J.W. WEATHERILL (Cheltenham—Minister for Environment and Conservation, Minister for Early Childhood Development, Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and Reconciliation, Minister Assisting the Premier in Cabinet Business and Public Sector Management): I am advised:

The APY Task Force program and funding commitments for the APY Lands expended in 2008-09 and of the programs allocated funding 2008-09, and how much funding each will receive in 2009-10, is summarised below.

The Task Force model of creating a central funding pool managed by the Aboriginal Affairs and Reconciliation Division of the Department of the Premier and Cabinet in conjunction with other service delivery agencies, has been highly successful in delivering specific and targeted services and programs to improve the health and well being of Aboriginal people and families on the APY Lands.

As clear examples of the benefits, the quality of drinking water has improved and the prevalence of petrol sniffing has reduced considerably. The 2008 Nganampa survey of petrol sniffing on the APY Lands reported a further significant reduction of 47 per cent in the incidence of petrol sniffing across the Lands in the previous 18 months, adding to the 54 per cent reduction estimated in 2007 and the 60 per cent fall in the 2006 survey. The rate of seizure of illegal substances (including alcohol) coming on the Lands has increased dramatically since 2006, and income from sales of artwork increased by 45 per cent from 2006.

A key to this success, is the pooling of funding that provides the flexibility to direct resources, as required, to the highest and most immediate service needs on the Lands. If the full budget allocation is not required by an agency in a particular financial year, then funds can be reallocated within that year to supplement other programs, such as the DFC Family Centres Program in 2008-09, and to other priority initiatives identified on the Lands during the course of the year.

APY TASK FORCE

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE (Morphett)** (26 June 2009).

The Hon. J.W. WEATHERILL (Cheltenham—Minister for Environment and Conservation, Minister for Early Childhood Development, Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and Reconciliation, Minister Assisting the Premier in Cabinet Business and Public Sector Management): I am advised:

The Taskforce was initially chaired by the Director Projects, Cabinet Office. It was later chaired by the Executive Director, Aboriginal Affairs and Reconciliation Division. The group initially met every two weeks and, once systems had been established, began to meet less frequently, usually on a monthly basis.

Approximately thirty meetings of the Taskforce were held. The last meeting of the formally constituted Taskforce was held on 14 May 2007. The work of the Taskforce was subsumed in the various ongoing activities of the five sub-groups that the Taskforce had established—Infrastructure, Health and Welfare, Justice, Education/Training and Employment, Legislative Review—and the development of the draft Aboriginal Strategic Plan which outlined key indicators for the improvement of Aboriginal development and wellbeing.

The activities of the Taskforce were also executed and supplemented by the establishment of the Tjungunku Kuranyu-Kuta Palyantjaku (TKP)—meaning 'Working Together Towards a Better Future'—which is a committee on the APY Lands that aims to improve services for Anangu through shared responsibility for policy development, service planning and co-ordination, and reporting on progress. The most recent meeting of the TKP committee was on 29 and 30 April 2009.

Aligned to the TKP, an Across-Government TKP Forum was established which holds regular meetings prior to and post the APY Lands TKP meetings. This across-government forum considers the TKP Action Plan and monitors the progress of the implementation of this Plan. The last meeting of this across-government forum was held on 11 March 2009.

NATURAL RESOURCES MANAGEMENT COUNCIL

The Hon. J.W. WEATHERILL (Cheltenham—Minister for Environment and Conservation, Minister for Early Childhood Development, Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and Reconciliation, Minister Assisting the Premier in Cabinet Business and Public Sector Management): I am advised:

There are no members in common sitting on the NRM Council and the Premier's Climate Change Council.

The NRM Council is not subject to direction by the Premier's Climate Change Council.

CARING FOR OUR COUNTRY

In reply to **Mr WILLIAMS (MacKillop)** (26 June 2009).

The Hon. J.W. WEATHERILL (Cheltenham—Minister for Environment and Conservation, Minister for Early Childhood Development, Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and Reconciliation, Minister Assisting the Premier in Cabinet Business and Public Sector Management): I am advised:

For 2008-09, the \$19 million Caring for our Country funding program is the Regional Base allocation provided by the Commonwealth for funding the programs operated by the Regional Natural Resource Management Boards in South Australia.

This portion of Commonwealth funding is provided to the state via a Single Holding Account held as part of DWLBC's administered entity.

Within the Portfolio Statements these amounts are shown as Receipts—Grant and Subsidies and Expenses—Grant and Subsidies within the Administered Item Cash Flow Statement (refer page 11.67 and 11.68).

The \$14.3 million relating to the State Complementary NRM funding portion is initially transferred as appropriation from Treasury to the DWLBC administered entity into the State Natural Resources Single Holding account. This comprises \$16 million in total funding less the cost for administration and governance of both the Commonwealth and State program (\$1.7 million comprising \$125K each for DEH and PIRSA & \$1.45 million DWLBC).

In the Portfolio Statements the total amount of \$16 million is shown as a State Government Receipt within the Administered Item Cash Flow Statement (page 11.67 and 11.68) and then as payments within Expenses—Grants & Subsidies.

The remaining \$4 million referred to relates to funding announced by the Commonwealth on the 21 July 2008 for the Landcare Sustainable Practices program. Unlike the Regional Base allocation, the \$4 million for the Land Care Component of Caring for Our Country does not go through DWLBC entity and therefore is not reflected directly within the Portfolio Statements. Of the amount provided, \$842K has gone to the regional NRM Boards, with the remaining funds distributed to non-government industry or environmental groups as well as some private businesses.

WATER ALLOCATION PLANS

The Hon. J.W. WEATHERILL (Cheltenham—Minister for Environment and Conservation, Minister for Early Childhood Development, Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and Reconciliation, Minister Assisting the Premier in Cabinet Business and Public Sector Management): There are currently no plans that are in need of review and have exceeded the five-year period for review.

REVEGETATION

In reply to **Mr WILLIAMS (MacKillop)** (26 June 2009).

The Hon. J.W. WEATHERILL (Cheltenham—Minister for Environment and Conservation, Minister for Early Childhood Development, Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and Reconciliation, Minister Assisting the Premier in Cabinet Business and Public Sector

Management): I am advised that there has been no policy change by the Native Vegetation Council to increase the area required for compensation.

The ratio for the 2008-09 scattered tree clearance was expected to be 10:1 based on figures from previous years. Significant environmental benefit offset requirements are determined using formulas that take into account the context of the trees within the environment, and their habitat significance. However, some landholders chose to set aside larger areas than required with a view to establishing an offset credit against future clearance. This resulted in the higher predicted ratio of 11:1. In fact, the final offset ratio for the year has been determined as 8.6:1 and this reflects further processing of applications after the estimated result was determined.

INCORPORATED ASSOCIATION

In reply to **Mrs REDMOND (Heysen)** (29 June 2009).

The Hon. G.E. GAGO (Minister for State/Local Government Relations, Minister for the Status of Women, Minister for Consumer Affairs, Minister for Government Enterprises, Minister Assisting the Minister for Transport, Infrastructure and Energy):

I am advised that Associations are incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act 1985. The Associations Incorporation Act is committed to the Attorney-General and is administered by the Commissioner for Corporate Affairs. The Commissioner for Corporate Affairs is also the Commissioner for Consumer Affairs.

I am advised that on 18 December 2008 the honourable member made a freedom of information application to the Office of the Liquor and Gambling Commissioner for information about an Association held under the Collections for Charitable Purposes Act 1939. The Collections for Charitable Purposes Act 1939 is committed to the Minister for Gambling. I am advised that on 16 February 2009 the Office for Liquor and Gambling complied with the freedom of information application and provided the honourable member with the requested documentation.

COMMUNITY WASTE MANAGEMENT SCHEMES

In reply to **Mrs REDMOND (Heysen)** (29 June 2009).

The Hon. G.E. GAGO (Minister for State/Local Government Relations, Minister for the Status of Women, Minister for Consumer Affairs, Minister for Government Enterprises, Minister Assisting the Minister for Transport, Infrastructure and Energy): I am advised:

1. The nine year funding agreement for CWMS commenced on 1 July 2008 and continues until 30 June 2017. In 2009-2010, the State Government is providing \$3.453 million in subsidy funding for the construction of new CWMS schemes across South Australia. Funding levels for subsequent years will be indexed to CPI.

2. The current program for 2009-10 comprises:

- Completion of three current construction projects (American River, Gladstone and Springton);
- Continued construction of the Port Wakefield scheme;
- Scheduled commencement of construction of another 6 schemes, subject to availability of funds both from the Subsidy Fund and from the local authorities themselves (Beachport, Donovans, Tulka, Mallala, Two Wells and Mount Compass);
- Activities such as feasibility, preliminary design or more advanced pre-construction progression of another 13 schemes (Middleton, Stansbury, Port Vincent, Wirrabara, Cowell, Arno Bay, Inglewood/Houghton, Mylor, Summertown/Uraidla, Virginia/Paracombe/Angle Vale, Penneshaw, Auburn and Peterborough).

MINISTERIAL OFFICE EXPENSES

In reply to **Mr PISONI (Unley)** (30 June 2009).

The Hon. J.D. LOMAX-SMITH (Adelaide—Minister for Education, Minister for Mental Health and Substance Abuse, Minister for Tourism, Minister for the City of Adelaide): The Department of Education and Children's Services has provided the following information:

The Ministerial Office resources have increased by \$0.083 million in 2009-10. The major influence on the increased costs was due to an increase in the accommodation charges.

SCHOOLS, CRITICAL INCIDENTS REPORTS

The Hon. J.D. LOMAX-SMITH (Adelaide—Minister for Education, Minister for Mental Health and Substance Abuse, Minister for Tourism, Minister for the City of Adelaide): The Department of Education and Children's Services has provided the following information:

Schools are required to report critical incidents. While the report is required to identify the school, the date of the incident and provide a brief description of the incident, the report does not necessarily identify student characteristics such as non-English speaking background, Aboriginality, special needs or the particular disability of a student.

BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT FUNDING

In reply to **Mr HANNA (Mitchell)** (30 June 2009).

The Hon. J.D. LOMAX-SMITH (Adelaide—Minister for Education, Minister for Mental Health and Substance Abuse, Minister for Tourism, Minister for the City of Adelaide): The Department of Education and Children's Services has provided the following information:

The Bowden Brompton Community School is the South Australian Department of Education and Children's Services (DECS) Specialist behaviour management school. Its annual funding is \$2,922,260 based on the June 2009 Resource Entitlement Statement. The school has campuses in Brompton, Salisbury North and Christies Beach.

DECS also operates 3 learning centres: Beafield Education Centre (with campuses at Para Hills, Brahma Lodge, Windsor Gardens, and Paradise), Cowandilla Learning Centre and the Southern Learning Centre at Christies Beach. These centres provide intensive, short term programs and support to assist students from Reception to Year 12 who have been excluded from their school, to achieve behavioural and attitudinal change and to re-engage with appropriate educational settings and programs. The total budget for these centres for 2008-09 is \$3,582,800 which includes student transport.

EDUCATION AND CHILDREN'S SERVICES DEPARTMENT HEAD OFFICE

In reply to **Mr PISONI (Unley)** (30 June 2009).

The Hon. J.D. LOMAX-SMITH (Adelaide—Minister for Education, Minister for Mental Health and Substance Abuse, Minister for Tourism, Minister for the City of Adelaide): The Member is referred to the Hansard dated 9 September 2009 for details regarding his question.

ROAD SAFETY

In reply to **Mrs REDMOND (Heysen)** (1 July 2009).

The Hon. M.F. O'BRIEN (Napier—Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education, Minister for Road Safety, Minister for Science and Information Economy): The project 'Road Safety—Reaching the Target', aimed specifically at purchases and installations associated with the red light and safety camera network, was established within the 2005-06 budget process as a \$9.462 million program over 4 years. Within the 2007-08 Budget Papers, this amount was reported as the estimated total cost of the project.

Within the 2008-09 budget process, additional capital funding of \$3.5 million over 4 years was provided for 'Reaching the Road Safety Target—Safety Camera Program'. This funding represented an expansion of the program established within the 2005-06 budget.

Also within the 2008-09 budget, an additional \$1.750 million was provided to 'Reaching the Road Safety Target—Point to Point using Safe-T Cam'.

These three projects were consolidated within the 2008-09 Budget Papers, resulting in a reported total estimated cost of \$14.712 million.

Within the 2009-10 Capital Investment Statement, the projects 'Reaching the Road Safety Target—Safety Camera Program' and the 'Road Safety—Reaching the Target' project are consolidated under a single title. The project 'Speed Enforcement Using Safe-T-Cam' is reported separately. The 'Road Safety—Reaching the Target' project has a reported estimated total cost of 'n.a.' This reflects the ongoing nature of the red light camera program, for which funding currently exists out to 2011-12 for the purchase and installation of safety cameras. The reporting of 'n.a.' as a total estimated cost is consistent with other projects of an ongoing nature, such as 'Shoulder Sealing' and 'Bus Fleet Replacement Program' and annual programs.

Expenditures across all three components of the road safety camera projects are expected to remain within original funding allocations.

THEBARTON BIOSCIENCE PRECINCT

In reply to **Dr McFETRIDGE (Morphett)** (1 July 2009).

The Hon. M.F. O'BRIEN (Napier—Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education, Minister for Road Safety, Minister for Science and Information Economy): Stage 2 of the Thebarton Bioscience Precinct is a 5ha brownfields site, with a 100+ year history as a leather tannery, prior to being purchased by the government in 2003.

Since being appointed to manage the site in 2004, Bio Innovation SA has been working with environmental consultants and an environmental auditor to return the site to the highest standard for commercial development.

Capital allocations have been carried over for site works in progress, in accordance with Treasury guidelines, to achieve optimal environmental outcomes for the site.

MINISTERIAL LIAISON OFFICERS

In reply to **Mr PENGILLY (Finniss)** (1 July 2009).

The Hon. M.F. O'BRIEN (Napier—Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education, Minister for Road Safety, Minister for Science and Information Economy): In the 2008-09 financial year, 8.6 DFEEST FTE's were allocated to the Office for the Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education.

FURTHER EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT, SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT INTERNAL AUDIT

In reply to **Mr PISONI (Unley)** (1 July 2009).

The Hon. M.F. O'BRIEN (Napier—Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education, Minister for Road Safety, Minister for Science and Information Economy): The Leave Recording System is audited by both the Auditor General and by DFEEST Internal Audit.

DFEEST has policies and processes that govern the manner in which leave is applied for and approved. This includes sick leave.

Workgroup Managers are responsible for ensuring that staff apply for leave of absence on those occasions where they are absent from the workplace.

An employee makes an on-line application for sick leave through the Employee Self Service (ESS) system, as soon as they return to work from their absence. That application is approved by their manager and then forwarded to Shared Services SA Payroll for processing.

Workgroup Managers are also responsible for ensuring that all leave details on the Bonafide Certificates are reconciled against a leave report from ESS and also reconciled to the timesheets. This happens on a fortnightly basis.

The Hon. M.F. O'BRIEN (Napier—Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education, Minister for Road Safety, Minister for Science and Information Economy):

1. In response to the first part of the member's question, I direct him to the following table, that indicates that the estimated number of dependents in 2010-11 is 37, not 67 as indicated in the *Hansard* extract of 1 July 2009:

2. All students enrolling at Adelaide High School must enrol at the school in accordance with the school's enrolment policy. The policy was published in the government Gazette on 19 March 2009. The dependents of international higher degree by research students will be treated in the same manner as local students and will need to enrol at Adelaide High School in accordance with the school's enrolment policy. Adelaide High School has the capacity to accept all students who enrol at the school in accordance with the policy.

FURTHER EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT, SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT

In reply to **Mr PISONI (Unley)** (1 July 2009).

The Hon. M.F. O'BRIEN (Napier—Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education, Minister for Road Safety, Minister for Science and Information Economy): DFEEST has had a 2FTE increase on a comparative basis (June 2008 v June 2009).

YOUTH CONSERVATION CORPS

In reply to **Mr PISONI (Unley)** (1 July 2009).

The Hon. M.F. O'BRIEN (Napier—Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education, Minister for Road Safety, Minister for Science and Information Economy): The most recently available cost per participant for the Youth Conservation Corps program for a full financial year was \$3,236 in 2007-08.

The cost per participant for programs and projects assisting young people into training and employment through South Australia Works vary depending on the scope of the program, the types of activity and assistance funded and the characteristics of those participating, i.e. their relative

level of disadvantage and existing educational levels. Because of this variation in scope the cost per individual program within South Australia Works is generally not directly comparable.

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES AND SKILLED MIGRATION

In reply to **Mr PISONI (Unley)** (1 July 2009).

The Hon. M.F. O'BRIEN (Napier—Minister for Employment, Training and Further Education, Minister for Road Safety, Minister for Science and Information Economy): The Minister for Industry and Trade has provided the following information:

1. The Skilled Independent Regional (SIR visa), now called a Skilled Regional Sponsored visa has worked and residency requirements before permanent residency can be achieved.

For SIR migrants residing in Australia for between 12 and 18 months (Source: Department of Immigration and Citizenship (DIAC) Longitudinal Survey of Immigrants to Australia).

- 97.8 per cent were employed (higher than the Australian population average), whilst the SA employment rate was almost identical at 97.7 per cent.
- Whether this employment was in a skilled occupation varied depending on whether the migrant was from an English speaking background.
- 93 per cent of survey respondents remained in the state in which they were sponsored.
- Upon future achievement of permanent residency, 89 per cent indicated no intention to move from the regional area in which they were residing.

2. We have now reached agreement between our governments on the draft terms of the proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

The Department of Trade and Economic Development will now undertake final consultation with both the Commonwealth Department of Immigration and Citizenship (DIAC), which has the sole legislative authority for Australia's immigration program, and also the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade.

Currently it is not possible to specify a date when the MOU will be signed. The government's priority is on job opportunities for existing South Australian residents.

3. The Premier's visit to New Zealand coincided with a major skills and careers expo in New Zealand and generated a significant profile for this event and importantly, for South Australia as a whole. It led to a considerable number of enquiries at the expo and later enquiries via the 'Make the Move' portal.

In recent years our number of settler arrivals from New Zealand has increased considerably from 232 persons in 2002-03, to 508 persons in 2007-08.

ADELAIDE PLAINS WATER SUPPLY STUDY

In reply to **Mr PEDERICK (Hammond)** (1 July 2009).

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD (Chaffey—Minister for the River Murray, Minister for Water Security): The Adelaide Plains Water Supply Study is a project to investigate the use of groundwater as an alternative supplementary water source for Adelaide. Preliminary findings from the study indicated there is potential for approximately 10 GL per annum.

The next stage of the project will comprise detailed design, construction, and operation of a pilot system to assess the feasibility of treating T1 and T2 aquifer water for possible blending into mains supply.

SA Water's investigations to date include groundwater quality measurements, well location survey, and preliminary concept design work has already been undertaken.

CRITICAL WATER ALLOCATIONS

In reply to **Mr PEDERICK (Hammond)** (1 July 2009).

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD (Chaffey—Minister for the River Murray, Minister for Water Security):

1. The Critical Water Allocation scheme water was purchased from early October 2008 through to mid January 2009. The average price for the purchased water was \$377 per megalitre.

The average price of water trades in the NSW Murrumbidgee Valley for the same period as recorded in the NSW WMA (Water Management Act) water register is \$382 per megalitre.

As approximately 60 per cent of all temporary water allocation purchases by the South Australian Government in 2008-09 was sourced from the Murrumbidgee Valley, it is considered a reasonable basis for estimating market price over a relatively long period.

2. In relation to the Coleambally transaction, the price paid for 10 GL of temporary water purchased from Coleambally Irrigation was \$375 per megalitre (not \$370 per megalitre as reported) comprising water allocations from 58 irrigators within Coleambally. Agreement with Coleambally was confirmed on 17 April 2009.

Market prices in early to mid April 2009 were generally in the range of \$340 per megalitre to \$360 per megalitre as evidenced by price bulletins for water sales issued by the Water Exchange and Waterfind, two large on-line water broking services. Also, over the same period, asking prices reported in Waterfind alerts and the Water Exchange bulletins were within the bandwidth of \$340 per megalitre to \$370 per megalitre.

Accordingly, the Opposition's assertion that the Government struck a price per megalitre of 10 per cent above the market value in order to secure the necessary volume of temporary water allocations is nonsense. The final price paid per megalitre was not only well considered given market value conditions at the time, but also very reasonable for the significant volume of water that was purchased and an economic way to transfer a significant volume of water.

STORMWATER

In reply to **Mr PEDERICK (Hammond)** (1 July 2009).

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD (Chaffey—Minister for the River Murray, Minister for Water Security): In regard to the breakdown of the announcement made on page 12 of Budget Paper 1, I refer the Honourable Member to page 2.27, table 2.13 of Budget Paper 3. That Budget Paper breaks down the budgeted spending over the next four years and shows that the total value of projects that could be funded at the time of constructing the budget was \$52.266 million, with \$26.132 million being provided by the State and \$26.134 million being sought from the Australian Government.

In response to the Australian Government's special call for Stormwater Harvesting and Reuse Projects as announced in March 2009, the State Government offered to partner with a number of proponents and was thus able to increase the total value of projects submitted for Australian Government funding. The bid put forward is valued at \$145.1 million for seven stormwater projects across the metropolitan area.

In addition to the \$26.1 million identified in the 2009-10 Budget, existing agency budgets will contribute in the order of \$19 million, bringing the total State Government commitment to over \$45 million for these projects. The State Government is seeking in the order of \$64 million from the Australian Government.

The proportional breakdown of contributions is contained in the following table, although it should be noted that final distribution of costs between partners will depend on Australian Government investment decisions.

The Hon. K.A. MAYWALD (Chaffey—Minister for the River Murray, Minister for Water Security): The project is still active and is due for completion October 2009.

There has not been any cost overrun on the original Full Financial Approval of \$1.733 million and this is not expected to be exceeded.
